



The estimated value of the vehicle is less than \$2,000.00 and a reserve of \$750.00 will be set.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the appropriate City Officials have hereby authorized this sale and the funds from this sale shall be deposited back into line item: 2420-64010 (*Support Equipment*);

HEREBY, the appropriate City Officials are hereby authorized to execute an agreement between the City of Williamsport, Bureau of Fire and PublicSurplus.com and any documents necessary to accept the contract and complete the sale to the highest successful bidder.

## Williamsport Bureau of Fire Memorandum

**Re:** 2007 Chevrolet Impala

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In 2008, the Williamsport Bureau of Fire purchased a used 2007 Chevrolet Impala from Blaise Alexander Chevrolet for approximately \$35,000 for use by the Fire Chief.

This vehicle has approximately 101,000 miles and was significantly damaged in July 2019 when a windstorm blew a tree onto it (see attached pictures). The A-Post on the passenger side was crushed, the passenger side mirror broken off, and the front passenger door window and windshield were smashed. Scott Jolin made repairs at the Streets & Parks Garage. To save money, the crushed A-Post was repaired but not replaced, but all other broken parts were replaced.

Around 2013, Chief Heinbach responded to an incident and parked the vehicle under power lines involved in the incident. The plastic insulation on the wires melted and dropped onto the vehicle. In order to save money, the Maintenance Engineers at the time were tasked with taking care of its removal from the vehicle. Not having body repair experience, the only way to get it off was to use a scouring pad, which caused the clearcoat to be taken off in the spots around the melted plastic. The clearcoat was never reapplied to those areas.

Some mechanical issues have been addressed, but a slipping transmission will cost more than the value of the vehicle.

We would like to sell it on Public Surplus to the highest bidder with a reserve of \$750.

The Williamsport Bureau of Fire requests that the proceeds from this sale be deposited back into line item 2420-64010 (*Support Equipment*) to aid in the annual payment of Car-

1 (2019 Chevy Tahoe). We received a State Fire Grant that will cover \$15,000 of the \$16,004.06 final payment.
